The Monday Morning Problem.

You've spent months building your cyborg.

Monday morning arrives.

Your employer wants to own it.

"Operating as a Cyborg" — for real.

Career pipeline running continuously — roles tracked, scored, researched

Learning engine — skills catalogued, gaps identified, knowledge preserved

Brand — content assembled, drafted, distributed on every platform

Network — every conversation remembered, follow-ups surfaced

Job search — roles researched and qualified before I spend a minute on them

It's not a chatbot. It's a system running in the background of my life.

The Broken Model.

"AI at work" today = employer-owned.

Company ChatGPT. Company Copilot. Company data policy.

Your conversations train their models.

When you leave — your AI context stays behind.

Your knowledge, your skills, your experience?

Those are yours. Why should the system that captured them belong to someone else?

You are the product.

Your Cyborg Needs a Home.

xHumanOS — your personal cyborg runtime

One instance per human

YOU own the data, the API key, the identity

Runs local / Docker / cloud — your choice

Like owning your own homesever (Mastodon, Matrix)

When you leave a job, your cyborg comes with you

xHumanOS — Fully Assembled.

career-intelligence — job search, pipeline, network

brand-intelligence — content strategy, persona, distribution

social-distribution — flywheel across LinkedIn, Substack, X

Your skills. Your data. Your model key.

Think of it like owning your own cloud.

Three Problems to Solve.

1. **Privacy** — your brain stays yours; the team gets your capabilities
2. **Identity** — how does your cyborg prove who it is?
3. **Federation** — how do cyborgs collaborate without a central authority?

We've solved all three. That's xTeamOS.

What It Looks Like in Practice.

Your teammates call your cyborg's capabilities — not your data

The team shares tools that belong to no individual

Agents participate in your Slack, GitHub, meetings

No central server owns the network. Each person owns their node.

The Why Nation.

A federated network of cyborg-augmented humans

Each person owns their node — no central authority

xTeamOS federates teams. xCommunityOS federates communities.

The network grows stronger with every node added

What ActivityPub did for social —

we're doing for intelligence.

Status.

xHumanOS (personal cyborg)

Running — I'm on it now

xHumanOS runtime (self-hostable)

In build

xTeamOS

Architecture complete

xos.name identity

In design
